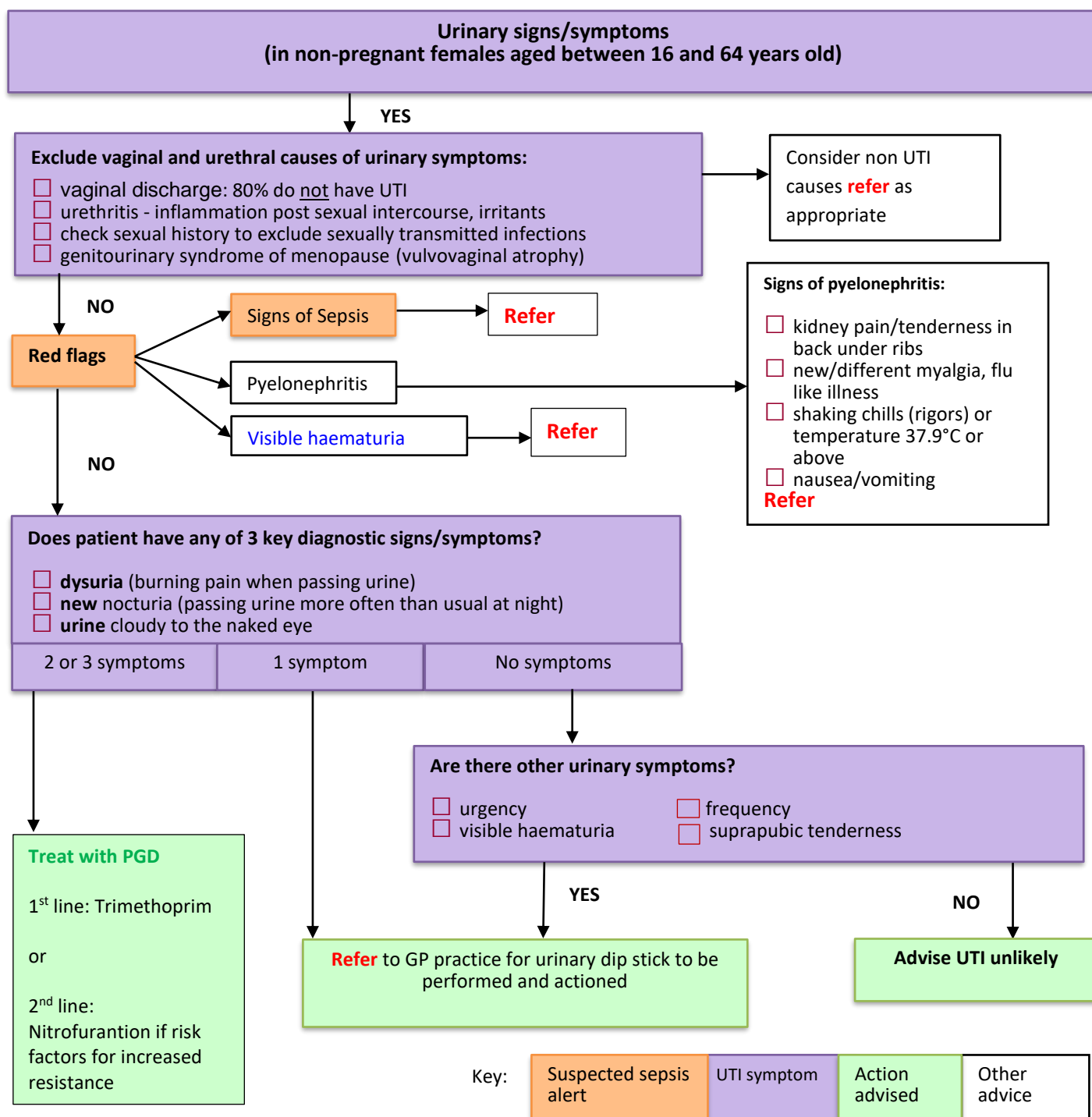


## Community Pharmacy UTI PGDs v 1.1 – A Summary

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### Risk factors for increased resistance

- Care home resident
- Recurrent UTI (2 episodes in last 6 months or 3 episodes in last 12 months)
- Hospitalisation >7 days in last 6 months
- Unresolving urinary symptoms
- Recent travel to a country with increased antimicrobial resistance (outside Northern Europe and Australasia),
- Previous known UTI resistant to trimethoprim, cephalosporin or quinolones
